Just a few lines
Hoping to find you are all well.
I was very sorry to hear of the
children being so sick & it is a
blessing they got better. So
how you must have been frightened
of them getting so sick. We had
a letter from Annie on Tuesday
telling us about it. We have not
been so well since I came up.
Jack & the children had the
colds first & the last three
days I have had it. I took
a dose of oil yesterday & feel
much better to-day. Dear Sara
I must tell you about the
lovely rain we have had. I
hope you have had the same
down there it started yesterday

11. evening & rained nearly all night & we
have had
some lovely showers this morning, I have heard

that we must have had between
2 & 3 inches. It was very acceptable
as there was no scrub feed here
this place looked almost as bare
as Hodgson. I hope you have
had it down there & I hope
Annie has had some as they were
short of feed Annie said when she
wrote. I don't know if you are
at home or not, I will send
this up to Fernvale, I don't know
if Rose will be coming away or not
if she is going she will have to write
away to-day. There is a good nurse
up here a Mrs Arbotnot. They
bought Harveys place & she has
been looking after several people
here. Give my love to Alf & the
children & accept the same
your dear self hoping you
get over your troubles well &
have a good time
